This celebration will acknowledge his anniversary of priesthood and forthcoming retirement on June 28th.

It is my understanding that the Pope has granted a plenary indulgence for those who honor Our Lady, even though not at Fatima.

The busyness of Easter has passed, yet we are still in the Easter season until Pentecost on June 4<sup>th</sup>. The month of May has special meaning for Catholics this year. During this month, we not only remember our Mother Mary, but we also celebrate her appearance to the three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal six times every 13<sup>th</sup> of the month, May-October, 1917. During these apparitions, Mary's message was simple: She asked for prayers, reparation, repentance, sacrifice, and abandonment of sin. Our Lady stressed the importance of praying the Rosary, asking the children to pray the Rosary every day for peace. Our Blessed Mother indicated to us the specific root of all the troubles in the world, the one that causes world wars and such terrible suffering: sin. She then gave a solution. God asks each one of us to stop offending Him. We must pray, especially the Rosary. By this frequent prayer of the Rosary, we will get the graces we need to overcome sin. During Pope Francis' visit to Portugal to celebrate the Centennial, he will canonize two of the three children, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, and they will become the Catholic Church's newest saints.
